OBJECTIVES

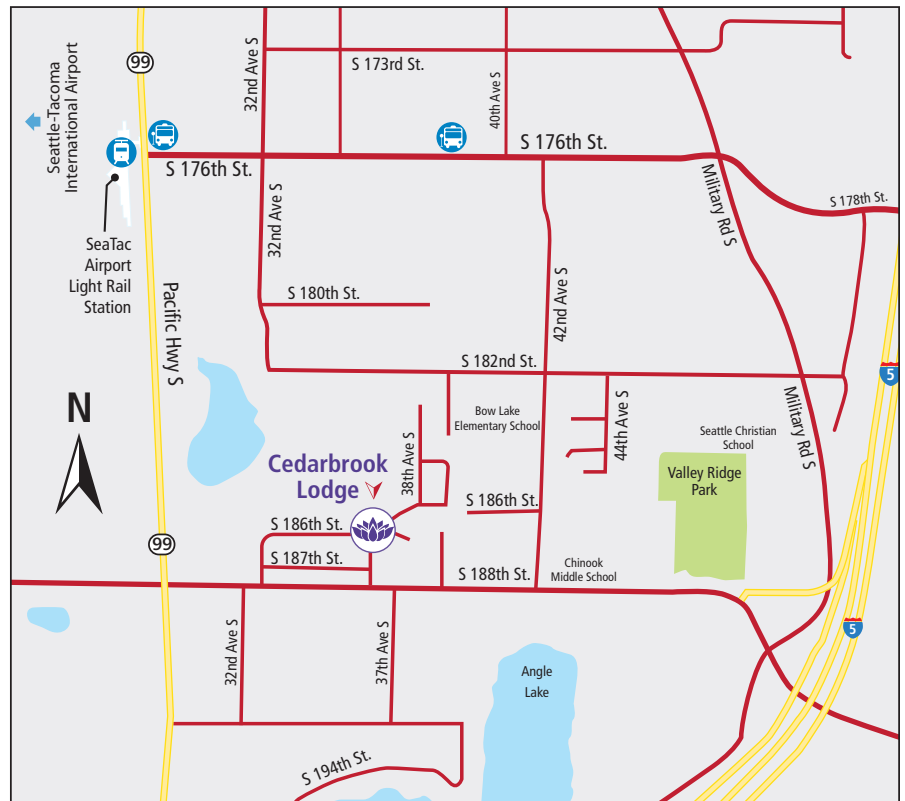
Select option 2 for shuttle pick up. At the airport, you will be picked up in the transportation level at Island 1 or 3.
